Summary of Proposed Changes:

- New route providing local connections between South Bellevue Link Station, Factoria, and Issaquah's transit centers
- Replaces Route 200 service on NW Gilman Blvd

Why is this change being proposed?

- Provides new local connections between South Bellevue Link Station, Factoria, and Issaquah
- Provides new service on Newport Way between Issaquah and Eastgate

How does this respond to feedback Metro received in Phase 1?

- Provides more local neighborhood connections to transfer to Link light rail.

* Frequent - The bus comes every 15 minutes or less during peak periods and every 30 minutes or less during off-peak periods.

* Local - All-day bus service that does not meet the standard for frequent.

* Peak-only - The bus comes only 5-9 a.m. and 3-7 p.m. These are the times of day Metro and Sound Transit sees the most riders, usually regular commuting times, Monday through Friday.
